**Subject: Solidarity with the ETUCE member organisation FSLE in Romania**

Dear colleagues,

The ETUCE wishes to express its full solidarity with you and all your members in Romania for the current country wide protest actions and next week's rally in Bucharest.

Your organisation decided to join several days of protest under the slogan "Together for Education!". Since yesterday, all Romanian high schools' teachers and students have protested in the school yards to the ongoing sound of the school bells. On 1 June 2016, you expect about 15.000 teachers to come out on the streets of Bucharest to gather outside the building of government, then to walk through town and to the Palace of the Romanian President. With this action, you'll give a strong signal for the importance to invest more means into public education. ETUCE welcomes your action launched and wishes you great success!

This is a good time for you to demand an increase of the teachers' salaries. It is clearly an economic and social misjudgment in the current situation to almost undermine the education system, to jeopardize and weaken essentially our sector which was identified as one of the key sectors to lead Europe out of the economic crisis. It is only fair that you raise your voice for an increase of the teachers' wages which has apparently not happened for a long time and led to such unjustified and unacceptable differences between the different public sectors. With this demand for a fair pay it is also about the recognition of the daily contributions and the high performance of teachers.


